# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Adelaide City will unveil a snapshot to the future direction in May. Atalanta BC's head of affiliation in Oceania Domenico Gangemi, will be in town conducting scouting and coaching missions for a select few junior players. The clinics are sold out as the club opens valuable windows of opportunities to our juniors and coaches and officials that are keen to broaden their football network and knowledge.

Domenico's May visit is the precursor to Atalanta BC sending out two Italian coaches, one with Serie A playing experience for an Atalanta BC July school holiday camp to Adelaide.

This camp will be exclusive, first to Adelaide City juniors with just 120 spots available. This experience will see our affiliation with Italy's leading development club take precedence as our junior players will be in the spotlight for a chance to impress Atalanta BC's scouts for a first trip to Italy in October. This will give our juniors priority in being seen in front of Atalanta BC's resourceful eyes. Atalanta BC will encourage our best players to take the next step in their young football lives.

I have reiterated this message several times, but our affiliation is direct and we're dealing club to club.

We are talking to the absolute heads of Atalanta BC's youth development team as part of the agreement.

They are extremely keen to see our club become a leader in Australian youth development.

This is the difference between what our club offers – there is no other club in this state which has the same development pathway abroad.

Our club does not endorse any external football academies outside of this great world first affiliation with Atalanta BC.

Adelaide City is in the process of being reset on and off the field with children at the top of our thoughts, they will be the ones that will continue to ensure our club's culture is of utmost importance.

The future is football development but unless we have everyone on board that goal is fruitless.

***That is the club's No. 1 priority.***

We'll be making changes to ensure our people are on the same page. Since the club was born in 1946 the aim was always to be the best at the very top of the tree which was achievable.

The proof was Adelaide City claiming three National Soccer League championships, 19 men's domestic titles. 11 women's domestic titles plus several cup trophies. However, the succession and strategic plan in sustaining success has always been questionable despite the club being flush with juniors that should have always had the opportunity to become our senior players. It's now up to us to make it happen.

# CITY WOMEN WITH LIZ ZIKOS

With less than 100 days until the FIFA women's World Cup Australia and New Zealand 2023 kicks off, I reflect on how the game in Australia has changed since I played more than 35 years ago.

I was 20 years old when the first inaugural national tournament was held in 1991.

During my playing days there were national championships held each year in capital cities where each state/region would send a team to compete.

The competition was dominated by Queensland, New South Wales and Northern New South Wales.

For me it was an honour to be selected to represent Queensland at four national championships, reaching the final at all four, winning twice and being runner up twice. One of my fellow Queensland teammates was Raelene Dower who is currently head coach of the Australian U-17 women's national team and Football Australia's technical director for women's football.

With barely any media coverage back then, the championships were one of the few events where the national coach was able to see players in action, but the championships ended in 1996 when other national women's leagues were set up.

The league folded in 2004 when 'state' teams developed into club sides, with Adelaide Sensation being our local team.

After that the W-League and more recently A-League women commenced as our national competition.

The growth of the women's game had continued around the world, and calls grew for a FIFA women's World Cup tournament, a women's Invitational tournament was organised by FIFA in China in 1988 to test if a global women's World Cup was feasible. The tournament was a great success, and three years later in 1991, the inaugural FIFA Women's World Cup was held, with China hosting the tournament.

Australia missed out on qualification after losing the Oceania Cup to New Zealand on goal difference.

The 1995 FIFA Women's World Cup was the first tournament at which Australia was referred to as the 'Matildas' and the moniker has stuck, and they have become one of the most popular national teams in the country.

The Matildas will go into the World Cup with confidence after their recent win over England and we should not be taking for granted this once in a lifetime opportunity to see as many games on home soil in July and August.

It's something I am looking forward to as a football fanatic!

# CLAUDIA'S JOURNEY IN FOOTBALL

When I began my football journey, I started as a field player. I was shuffled around the back line from centre back and left back and even got a shot as a winger for a short while. I didn't transition into a goalkeeper until much later. I was run through the state system from under 13s all the way through to NTC, predominantly as a left back.

However, three weeks out from NTC nationals and at the age of 17, City coach Paul Pezos and Adelaide City legend Ross Aloisi, chunked me in as a goalkeeper when all three of our keepers were injured. I then replaced those keepers at nationals and the following months was selected by the two of them again to be a train on for Adelaide United's women's side.

It was always a huge goal of mine to be in among a squad of such talented players to improve into their calibre. However, I didn't think it was going to be as a goalkeeper.

I was incredibly lucky that the first goalkeeper I trained and learnt from was Melissa Barbieri – a Matildas goalkeeping legend. She was a huge inspiration for me as a young keeper and I learnt an incredible amount underneath her and another goalkeeper Sarah Willacy. The following season for Adelaide United I was signed as the backup keeper to an American international Kaitlyn Savage. Another incredible goalkeeper to learn under. Unfortunately, I never had the opportunity to make it off the bench but was so grateful to learn from someone with such talent.

It was then that I knew I wanted to go down the college route. When I graduated high school, I was offered a scholarship to La Salle University in Philadelphia. College soccer was something unreal to me, like nothing I had ever experienced. The training, the facilities, the coaching, the attention to detail, the work ethic- everything that I wanted in a program. It was akin to Adelaide United but all year round. My freshman year we won our conference and it will be forever a memory I hold very close to my heart.

In my summer holidays of college, I would return to Australia and play for Adelaide City until it was time to go back.

I have massive amounts of gratitude for Adelaide City as a club, always looking after me for those short months I was back.

The training was better than any other club in Adelaide, the coaching was sharp and focussed and the girls were not just talented but so hard working.

No other club could compare or prepare me for my seasons back in America. It was an easy decision to play for Adelaide City again, once I had graduated and returned permanently back to Australia.

The girls in that team are the best, they force me to be a better goalkeeper and a harder worker. The club has the reputation and standard above most clubs I've known.

This year has been particularly special being coached under Tiarn Powell. I remember playing as her teammate and now having her knowledge leading this young and very talented team is so exciting.

I am looking forward to seeing what we can do this year.
