PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Over the past 30 years, I have been fortunate to see the operations of football coaches at the highest level first-hand.

As a former journalist for NewsCorp Australia and contracted to Host Broadcast Services, the TV broadcasting organisation for FIFA World Cup tournaments, Asian Cups, and for the Olympic Games, I have been observing how clubs and national teams operate, from outside their bubbles, while doing a job which I loved.

This brings me to the point of coaching which - depending on how his or her team is performing - can either be the most rewarding job or one where there it's a very tough gig.

However, there is no doubt coaches are critical to the well-being of any football club operation. I have met, interviewed and became a conduit for several first-class coaches over the past three decades.

Adelaide City legend Aurelio Vidmar is a shining example.

More about Viddie later.

It brings me to the point of our club's leading senior coaches Tiarn Powell and Paul Pezos.

Tiarn is a first-year coach and Paul has earned respect by winning several trophies including the treble with Adelaide City last year.

I have learned through my journey and have been advised by those firmly entrenched in the game at the top level to allow coaches to do their work in their inner sanctum without distractions from the outside.

That includes the hierarchy, media scrutiny and everything else that could alter their focus and team plans but at the same time, there is always mutual respect.

Part of my job in the media was to delve into the inner sanctum of teams which was very rewarding and at other times confrontational as I tried to inform readers and my superiors what was going on inside a football bubble.

Through my experience and mostly now on the 'other side of the media,' I am a firm believer in leaving key decisions to the coaching experts that are trusted to do their jobs.

At a luncheon with Tiarn and Paul earlier this year we discussed the needs of both coaches regarding their valuable tools including squad strength, support staff and other items for the season.

Not delving into the inner workings of their football departments and ensuring they have the freedom to coach their teams and have a successful season was what I endorsed from the start and continue to do so.

We left the luncheon with my intentions made clear, I am a phone call away if Paul or Tiarn need help for any matter - anytime.

Liz Zikos, our club's women's football director and Angelo Carrozza, our men's football director, deal directly with Tiarn and Paul for all football matters and I see this as ideal for our club

Liz and Angelo report to the board as part of the process to help our coaches achieve their very hest

I am an observer from afar and a fan of all our teams at Adelaide City.

It brings me back to Aurelio.

His rise to becoming one of the best coaches in Asia during Adelaide United's incredible run towards the 2008 AFC Champions League final which earned the Reds a ticket at the FIFA Club World Cup was at the time extremely underrated

I was on that journey representing NewsCorp seeing just how difficult it was for Vidmar and his men especially travelling abroad where one destination took almost 36 hours from the time they left Australia to landing in Tashkent, Uzbekistan for a Champions League semi-final.

Aurelio and his men, a few months earlier, encountered one of the most hostile environments I have seen in football when the Reds faced Chanchung Yatai in China.

From the difficulty of scheduling training sessions in Changchung to scenes where some of the crowd launched seats and missiles at the Reds where an object aimed at the side smacked into former Adelaide midfielder Kristian Sarkies's mouth, seconds after the team qualified for the knockout stage of the Champions League.

One of Vidmar's strengths was in his ability to keep his side focussed and away from distractions that had no relevance towards his end goal of being the best in Asia.

His leadership was inspirational.

I had also had a close encounter with Marcelo Bielsa, the coach of Argentina at the 2002 FIFA World Cup, where as part of my job at HBS, I escorted him to the mixed media zone where the angry Argentine press called for his head there and then when the national team was knocked out of the tournament after their last group stage match.

Bielsa rose above the controversy to become one of the new-wave masterminds of football winning gold with Argentina at the 2004 Athens Games before locking himself away in a convent for a long period, claiming being knocked out of the World Cup was the saddest day of his life.

I was also in the Yokohama TV studio after Brazil coach Felipe Scolari led the Selecao to the FIFA World Cup title in Yokohama in 2002 celebrating with the new world champions.

He was king of the world, a man that was super strong in all aspects.

Four years later he led Portugal to fourth place at the Germany 2006 FIFA World Cup after taking the side to the Euro 2004 final.

It was working at the World Cup where I indeed observed how Guus Hiddink led the Socceroos in 2006 - with an iron fist.

Gossip and innuendo always abound but these coaches focussed only on the tasks at hand.

Every coach is different, but they must also have freedom to do their work unhindered.

This brings me back to Tiarn and Paul.

They have had the club's full support for 2023 which has been a challenging league season.

I sincerely wish for a better second half to their seasons and to have the freedom Adelaide City has given them to achieve their very best for the football club

Together we're stronger.

My journey with City has been nothing short of invigorating. My debut for the club was against Melbourne Victory in the Australia Cup match in 2021, and thus far has climaxed in the treble winning season of last year.

Here's a little snapshot of my footballing history: Being tall, and having a little experience of goalkeeping as a kid, my brother needed a fill-in in his Collegiate League team, Grads Red.

I was 16.

I performed well, and finding their comradery enlivening, I stuck around the club for another season, failing to turn out to training but arriving for match day (and the post-match barbeques). It was here that I won my first championship, of which my taste for glory has not departed - watch out MetroStars.

The executive of the Grads 'kicked me out' for greener pastures, and I signed with West Adelaide at age 18.

After a successful personal stint at West Adelaide, Paul Pezos, our current head coach and the then coach of United's youth team, phoned and I was signed by Adelaide United less than 13 months after my Grads Red experience.

How fast things change in this world!

Here's an aside.

I value independence highly. The first day of graduating high school I moved into an apartment with my brother and have never looked back. Couches and bookshelves sitting on the side of the road assume a completely new charm in these circumstances. Beyond enjoying autonomy, I read eclectically and have taught myself German.

I also find much joy in coaching two of Adelaide's brightest young women goalkeepers. Speaking of goalkeepers, the other keepers in the Adelaide City keeper union also add colour to my life, despite what I tell them; you'll be hard-pressed to find a more tightly knit group.

In closing, it's possible this relates to today's game. I wear old Italian leather boots in wet weather football; the first time I wore them I was asked to return them to the museum. But they were a gift, so they remain my go-to shoes.






As we come up to the midpoint of the season, coming off a Cup win against rivals West Adelaide 5-3 we look to face up to them again tonight.

We also see this with the A-League women's players Dylan Holmes and Isabel Hodgson continuing to return to the club to play following the completion of their season with Adelaide United.


The Di Bartolo Family are also a


