PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

In this week's edition of the Gazzebra here's a recap of last Sunday's Annual General Meeting at the Adelaide City Function Room, Oakden. Congratulations to new board members as voted by Adelaide City members during the AGM.

Eric Fantasia has been reappointed to the board. We have new board members and they include Tony Tavella and Glenn Dods. They will join myself, Charlie Zollo, Tony Antenucci, Mark Pangallo and Angelo Carrozza to form an eight-person board.

Here is a copy below of my president's address that kick started the AGM which from all accounts was the best turn out in several years.

Dear Adelaide City life members, player life members, life governors and members.

Welcome to the club's Annual General Meeting at our Adelaide City Function Room. My name is Valentino Migliaccio and honoured to be bestowed as the president of this great football club which was founded in 1946 by Italian immigrants.

This club has become one of the iconic success stories giving new Australians a sense of belonging and a taste of Italy's various regions whenever they gathered for matches in the state leagues and the now defunct NSL.

I have been a lifelong fan of this club since my father Stefano took me to my first game and I can't recall if it was Norwood Oval or Olympic Sports Field, Kensington.

I can tell you several stories about how this club was built with the bare hands of hard-working volunteers, remembering years ago going to Kensington to work as a labourer while I was still in school to help the builders on weekends, so our club had changerooms and a clubroom. There are several people in this room that were there all helping to drive the ambition of the club

forwards at that building site.

And the countless volunteers where the club became the most progressive sports hub in the state.

If we have solutions and endorse fresh ideas, to enable the replenishment of our club with youth and new faces and embrace change in this rapidly changing environment of life, we will survive. We now have an opportunity to propel this club back to the top of the game in Australia if we stand together, and, in essence we're all here for the good of this football club.

We are an independent board and I sincerely hope we can attract several female members to make this board stronger in future.

Let me introduce this current board (before voting at the AGM) and our wonderful hard-working advisors:

Charlie Zollo – Vice President; Tony Antenucci – Secretary; Mark Pangallo – Merchandise/marketing; Angelo Carrozza – Sports director/sponsorship; Eric Fantasia – Events/social. The advisors to the board are Liz Zikos (women's football), Marc Romaldi (legal), Joseph Altamura and Max Kim (finance), Alby Troisi and Vince Di Maria (junior football) and they have added value in their various roles.

The club has appointed Damien Picicella as the full-time chief administration officer. Damien has been in the job since February. Rick Petropolous is the club's operations manager in a part-time basis.

This board and advisors have since September 2022 worked extremely hard in sifting through a maze to ensure we're operating for the best interests of the football club and its future. The board had met weekly until the end of January and then mostly fortnightly to give Adelaide City a clear direction.

We're introducing changes to the club including a world first affiliation with Italian Serie A club Atalanta BC – Italy's No. 1 development club. Juniors have become a priority alongside the entire community they bring with them including parents, families, and friends.

Atalanta BC has opened several doors for our club regarding player movements and coaching education which are being explored. Italian coaches from Atalanta BC will be flying in during the July School Holidays, conducting coaching clinics and will scout our best children where they have the possibility of impressing the Italian Serie A club in October in Bergamo. No other club, academy or school in this state has that door-to-door football relationship and three young Australian players have attracted Atalanta BC's interest due to our club's network.

We also introduced a women's head coach for the first time in the club's history. Tiarn Powell is our women's coaching leader, and it fits well with the narrative of the FIFA women's World Cup which is on our shores from July.

We have also been accepted to apply for the second round of the National Second Division by Football Australia. This will give our club a chance to get back on the national stage and we're currently in preliminary talks.

Our board has also introduced several initiatives including reconnecting the past with the present, family dinner nights at our junior clubrooms on Unley Road and we're expanding our footprint and again becoming aligned with all the tight Italian based community groups that have the same goal – and that is to survive forever.

As for the football we're out to become better in all facets from seniors to juniors.

Our men's NPL side – after winning the amazing treble under coach Paul Pezos in 2022 has had a tough season to date and the side has the entire backing of the board. Our women's WNPL side is in the same boat under Tiarn Powell and that side again has the full support of the board.

We have recently introduced a Code of Conduct, Media and Social media protocols and we're working on a strategic plan and a youth development program which we will own and follow for years to come.

We are a huge club with more than 400 registered juniors and almost 80 senior players with more than 39 squads. About 2000 people are directly connected to our club but that doesn't transcend into game day attendances for our seniors apart from round 1 this year where 1300 watched City men smash West Adelaide 4-0 in the NPL.

We are also unique as the club has two football facilities – junior and senior - that are about 10km apart which is challenging for the entire club to connect daily. We're aiming to fix that to ensure we're always supporting each other regardless of which team is represented.

Can we become a better football club?

Of course, because each one of us I am sure want this club to aim for the top and that's something which we will rectify through strong leadership.

The bottom line for me is to ensure the wellbeing of the entire club is at the forefront of our thoughts. If we're all aligned with that same thought process, we will move forward and quickly.

RALE RASIC

1935 - 2023

It is with great sadness that Adelaide City announces the passing of Rale Rasic, a much-loved Australian football figure.

Rale was the first coach to lead the Socceroos to a FIFA World Cup when the then part-timers featured at the 1974 West German tournament.

The respected member of the Football Australia Hall of Fame then became coach of Adelaide City.

Rasic won the NSL Cup with Adelaide City in 1979, the club's first major national trophy.

Arguably his biggest feat during his two years at the club was attracting then glamour club New York Cosmos to Olympic Sports Field in 1979.

More than 28,000 fans packed the Kensington stadium to catch a glimpse of two FIFA World Cup winners, West Germany's Franz Beckenbauer and Brazil's Carlos Alberto.

Adelaide City extends its deepest sympathies to the Rasic family and friends.

ATALANTA BC COORDINATORS UPDATE

As a squad the girls have embraced current A-league women's players Isobel Hodgson and Dylan Holmes back for a portion of the season.

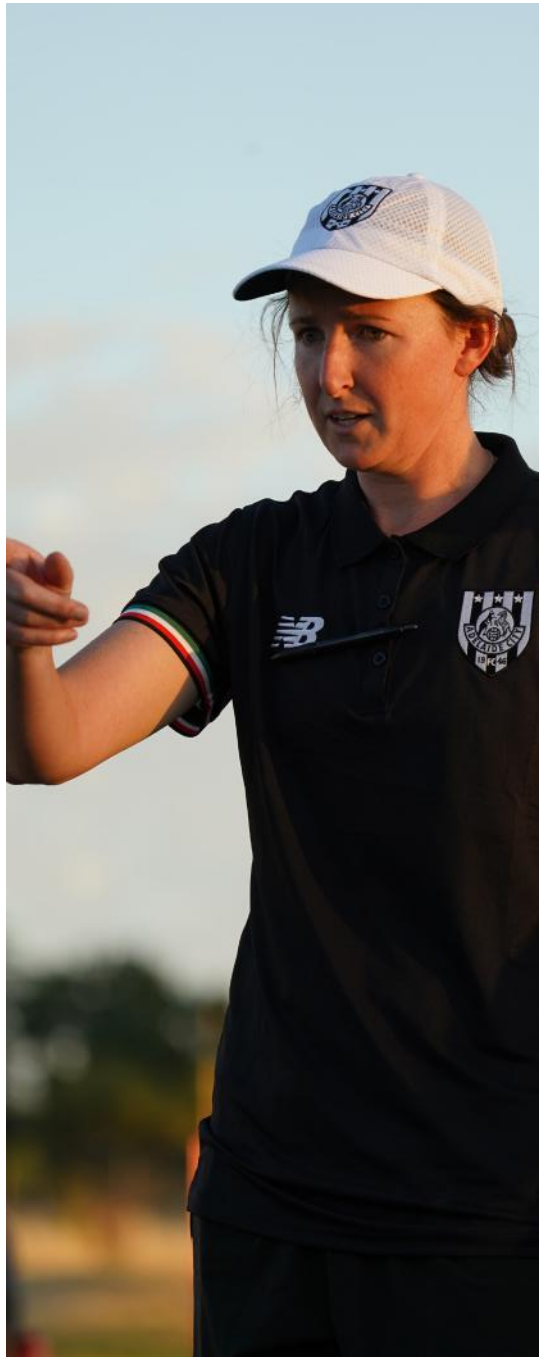
The intensity they bring to training and games is a level above and you can see the girls looking up to them, learning from them and improving just by being around them.

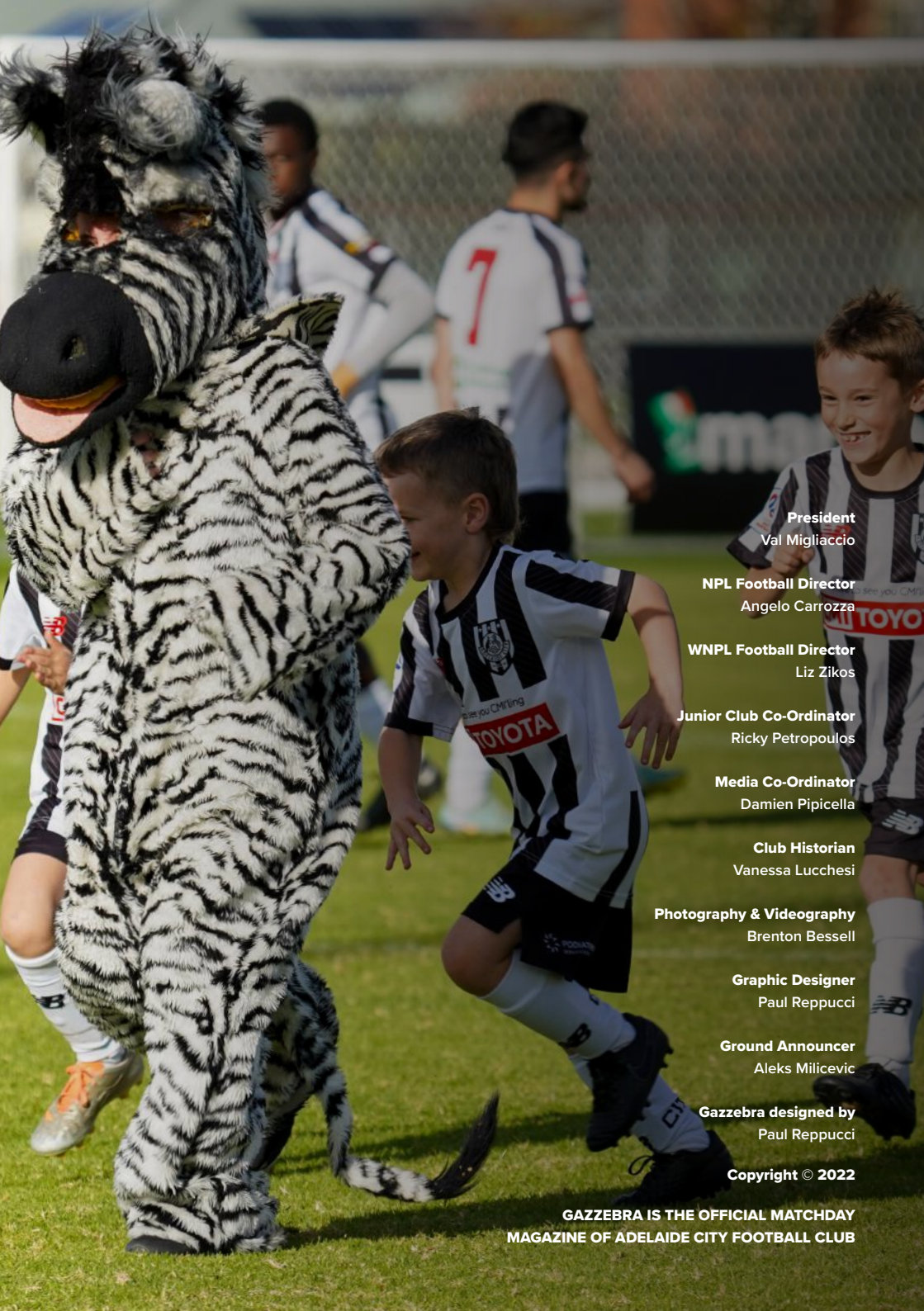
