

An exceptional cross from Juma set up our equalizer, and just minutes later, she produced a stunning cross-comeshot that lobbed the Comets keeper to give us a 2-1 lead. Though the final score ended in a 2-2 draw, it was a fair result, and I'm incredibly proud of how the team fought to secure that point.

Off the park, we've had another exciting week. Adelaide City FC made history as the first NPL team in Australia to be granted a license by US powerhouse New Era Cap. This means our official hats, made by New Era, will soon be available for sale — a fantastic new way to show your support!

We also held another unreal City Connect Business Series lunch, where 60 guests had the chance to network and hear from footballing great Anthony Dorigo. Tony, a former Adelaide junior, was the first Australian football export to play in Europe's big leagues, representing Aston Villa, Leeds, Chelsea, and Torino, before becoming an England international. His stories from his career—rooming with Paul Gascoigne, playing against legends like Robbie Baggio, Bergomi, and Donadoni, and even having his eye cut open by Toto Schillaci during the 1990 World Cup—were enthralling to hear firsthand. It was truly a memorable event

Looking ahead, our Adelaide City Black and White Ball is set for May, and tickets are selling fast. We encourage you all to get involved, as we've got an outstanding night planned with acts, auctions, and much more. 




# **CAPTAIN'S**

Affectionately known by all, as Mrs. Adelaide City, Franca Di Bartolo is an inspiring female force shaping the past, present and future of football at Adelaide City. Her dedication to the development of women's football is unmatched. and reflected through her playing achievements, roles as Coach, Manager and continuing role as Senior Administrator.

Franca kicked off her football career in 1982, playing for Cumberland Vixen's Women's Division 1 team. 1984 saw the first of what would be many contributions to Adelaide City's success, after earning a promotion as Captain of our Women's Division 2 (League Champions), to Captain of Women's Division 1.

Franca's playing career continued to blossom, earning her 3 Gold Medals (1996, 1998 and 2000) in the Asian Pacific Masters Games. Gold (2007) and Silver (1997) in the Australian Masters Games, Bronze (2002) in the World Masters Games and secured Women's Cup (2005) for City's Div 1. In 2006 Franca was awarded Player Life Member at both SAWSA and FFSA, FFSA Volunteer of the Year Award in 2009. Induction into the Hall of Fame in 2018 and just last year, Player Life Member at Adelaide City. Franca continues to be an inspiration, and a pillar to the success of our Club in 2025 and beyond.

On behalf of the Adelaide City Family. Thank-You Franca for all you do!

No one will ever know the sacrifice you put into playing, juggling family and work, then retiring to become a volunteer to make the success of a club, and keep it to high standards.

I have many memorable moments. but the one that stands out for me would be when I scored the winning goal (penalty) to win gold at my first masters, to honour my grandfather Charlie, at the club he loved.





# WHERE ARE THEY NOW

We checked in with Tony Dorigo to tell us about his journey.



66 Reflecting on my childhood

Dorigo's playing career spanned several prominent clubs:

#### Aston Villa (1983-1987)

111 league appearances and scored 2 goals.

### Chelsea (1987-1991)

146 league matches, 11 goals, and was named Chelsea Player of the Year in 1988.

### Leeds United (1991-1997)

Contributed to Leeds' First Division title win in the 1991–92 season, making 171 league appearances and scoring 6 goals.

### Torino (1997-1998)

Dorigo had a stint in Italy's Serie B, playing 30 matches and scoring 2 goals.

#### Derby County (1998-2000)

He returned to England, adding 41 league appearances and 1 goal to his record.

### Stoke City (2000-2001)

Concluded his playing career with 36 league appearances.

Born on December 31, 1965, in Melbourne, Australia, Tony Dorigo began his football journey in Adelaide, playing for local clubs including Cumberland United, West Torrens Birkalla, and Polonia (now known as Croydon).

By age 15, Dorigo was training with Adelaide City, which was the best team in Adelaide at the time. Demonstrating ambition early on, Dorigo sent letters to most English Premier League clubs seeking opportunities.

Aston Villa was the only club that responded, offering him a trial that led to his professional career in England.

Internationally, despite his Australian roots, Dorigo represented England. Initially, he was approached by Australia for the 1986 World Cup qualifiers, but club commitments prevented his participation.

Subsequently, after obtaining British citizenship, he earned 15 caps for England between 1989 and 1993, including participation in the 1990 World Cup.

After retiring from professional football, Dorigo transitioned into media and broadcasting. He has worked as a pundit and commentator for various networks, including Eurosport, Bravo, Channel 5, ESPN, and Sky Sports. Dorigo also serves as a club ambassador for Leeds United

Currently, Dorigo maintains an active presence in the football community through his media engagements and ambassadorial role. He shares insights and updates via his social media platforms, including Twitter and Instagram.
